Bridging Studies

Dr Fukase recognised with the publication, in the mid-90s, of the ICH E5 guidance pertaining to 'Ethnic Factors in the Acceptability of Foreign Clinical Data', the importance of the 'Bridging Study'.

Dr Fukase was the first investigator in Japan to perform a bridging study with White/Caucasian subjects and since that first study in the mid-90s, he has performed well over 40 bridging studies involving more than 650 White/Caucasian subjects. It is fair to say that he is one of the most if not the most experienced investigator in Japan in this area.

Recruitment

Volunteer recruitment is mainly through <u>word-of-mouth</u>. New volunteers are introduced to Tokyo Hospital by current volunteers. An English-speaking member of staff will then contact the potential volunteer to arrange an interview. After a successful interview the volunteer's information is added to the Caucasian volunteer database and mailing list

Currently there are around <u>300 to 400 active healthy Caucasian male volunteers</u> listed in the database and around <u>50 healthy Caucasian females</u>.

In cases where the numbers of volunteers are not sufficient to cover the needs of a particular study advertising on various Social Media is an option.
